

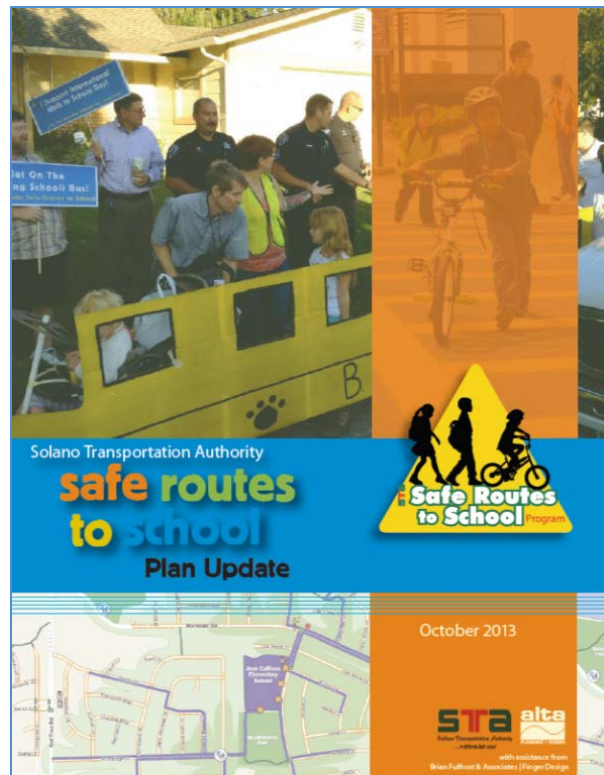

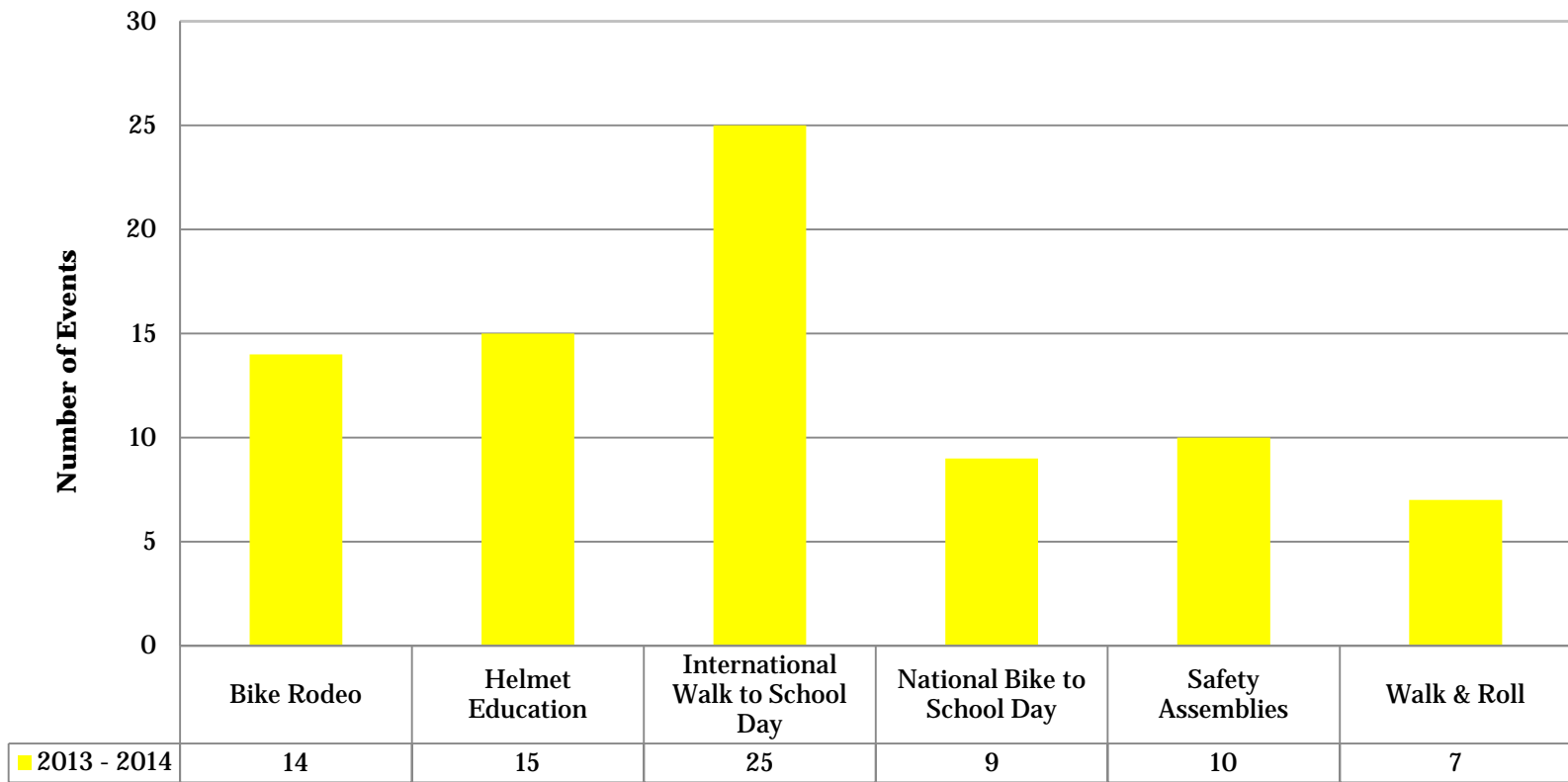
SR2S Program Highlights for FY 13-14



- SR2S Plan Update complete, adopted October 2013
- 42 schools, 2 sites participated in 80 Education and Encouragement events reaching over 12,000 students
- SR2S Advisory Committee met on a quarterly basis
- New program logo was adopted
- Round 2 of the Enforcement Grant released
- 18 schools with a Walking School Bus

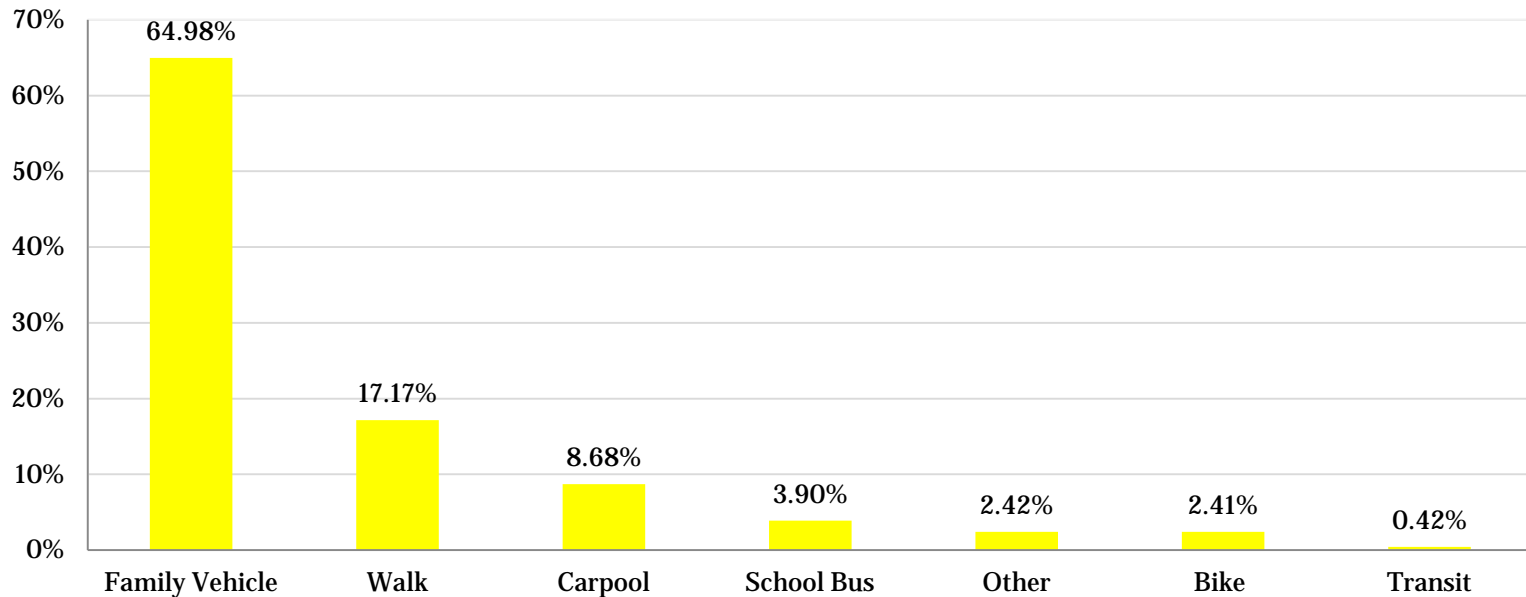
